Etymology. The word Maharaja originates in Sanskrit and is a compound karmadhāraya term from mahānt-"great" and rājan "ruler, king"). It has the Latin cognates magnum "great" and rex "king". Due to Sanskrit's major influence on the vocabulary of most languages in Greater India and Southeast Asia, the term Maharaja is common to many modern Indo-Aryan and Dravidian languages.
