Both Mac OS X and Mac OS X Server include Terminal, an application you can use to start a UNIX shell command-line session on the local server or on a remote server. To open Terminal: mClick the Terminal icon in the dock or double-click the application icon in the Finder (in /Applications/Utilities).
